
Program Compliance

Purpose

This policy requires that the Superintendent determine district compliance with certain program requirements.

Scope

This policy applies to the Board of Directors and the Superintendent.

Policy

1. On or before October 1st of each year, the Superintendent will determine if the district is in compliance with the following program requirements:
 - (a) Appropriate measures are taken to safeguard all student and school district permanent records against loss or damage.
 - (b) Provision is made for the supervision of instructional practices and procedures.
 - (c) Current basic instructional materials are available for required courses of study.
 - (d) A program of guidance, counseling and testing services is maintained for students in all grades offered by the school district.
 - (e) A learning resources program is maintained.
 - (f) The physical facilities of each district-school/program are adequate and appropriate for the educational program offered.
 - (g) There is adequate provision for the health and safety of all pupils students within the custody of the school district.
 - (h) A current policy statement pertaining to the administration and operation of the school district is available online or in each district building's administrative office including, but not limited to, policies governing the school building and classroom visitation rights of nonstudents.
 - (i) The district is in compliance with the statutes which prohibit unequal treatment of students on the basis of race, religion, creed, color, national origin, age, sex, sexual orientation (including gender expression or identity), honorably-discharged veteran or military status, marital status, the presence of any physical, sensory or mental disability, participation in Boy Scouts of America, or the use of a trained dog guide or service animal by a person with a disability in its programs and activities, and provides equal access to the Boys Scouts of America and other designated youth groups. -supported by common schools.
 - (j) A descriptive guide to the district's common schools is published annually by the Board of Directors and is made available at each school in the district for examination by the public.

- (k) Within each school, the school principal has determined that appropriate student discipline is established and enforced. The school principal has conferred with the certificated employees in the school building in order to develop and/or review building disciplinary standards and the uniform enforcement of those standards.
- (l) Written high school graduation requirements and rules have been adopted by the Board of Directors.
- (m) Equivalence among schools in teachers, administrators and auxiliary personnel and equivalence in the provision of curriculum materials and supplies among schools who receive Title 1 funds.

2. Deviations to the standards shall be reported to the board and will be incorporated into the annual guide.
